Preamble

The committee of experts constituted by the Kerala State Higher Education Councilheaded by Prof. BHrdayakumari,tostudyandmake recommendations for theimprovementofthe working of the Choice BasedCreditandSemesterSystemincolleges affiliatedtothe Universities in theState had submittedacomprehensivereport. Afterreviewing theentire scenariothis committee recommended to the Higher Education CouncilthatCBCSS maybe maintained with some basic reforms. Theold systemwas lackingininnovativeness andin thecapacity togripswith fastchangingglobal conditions. tocome Afewchangesinthecourseandexaminationpatternmay improvethesituation extent.The tosome ofthelearnershallbe ontheSeven Point GradingSystem.The PerformanceGrading absolutegradingsystemof07pointsisthemostpopulargradingsystemandhasbeenacceptedby the UNESCO, the Committee suggested that the overall structure of the 07 point grading systemmaybeconsidered by all affiliating Universities of the State. It shouldbeasimpleandclearmethod; forthe easy cleardistinction teachertooperate andthe studenttounderstand. There shouldbe If betweenlettergradessothattheassessmentisaspreciseaspossibleandjusttothestudent. necessaryfor the finalgrading at the endofthe programmeproper software could be devised to ensure exactitude as well as speedofevaluation. Teachers should use the marking system for each question for each course. Cumulative willbe ofthe finalmark listofthe Grading done during thepreparation programme.Itis notclaimedthattheSevenPoint RangeIndirect Grading is thelastword ingrading, butitis a well thought outpattern for all the affiliating Universities to consider, within the limits ofthe presentsystem. The State Governmenthas accepted the recommendations of the Committee and the Syndicate ofthe MahatmaGandhi University has resolvedtoreformthe existing CBCSSregulations. HenceitbecomesnecessarytomodifytheexistingCBCSS regulationas following.

1. TITLE

1.1. These regulations shall be called "Regulations for Under Graduate Programmes under Choice Based Course Credit Semester System and Grading, 2014"

2. SCOPE

- 2.1 Applicabletoallregularnon-professionalUnderGraduateProgrammesconductedbythe Collegefor2014dmissions.
- 2.2 Theoremses conducted indistance/off-campusand privateregistrationshall notcome under the purview of this regulation.
- 2.3 The provisions herein supersede all the existing regulations for the regular non- professional undergraduateprogrammes totheextent hereinprescribed.

3. DEFINITIONS

- 3.1. 'Academic Week' is a unitoffive working days in which distribution ofwork is organized from day-onetoday-five, with fivecontacthours of onehour duration oneach day. A sequence of 18 such a cademic weeks constitutes a semester.
- 3.2. 'AdditionalCourse' is a course registered by a student over and above the minimum required courses.
- 3.3. 'Audit Course' is a course for which no credits are a warded.
- 3.4. *'College Co-ordinator'*is ateachernominatedby the CollegeCounciltoco-ordinate the continuous evaluation undertaken by various departments within the college. He/she shall be no minated to the college level monitoring committee.
- 3.5. *'CommonCourseI'* means a course that comes under the category of courses for English and *'Common CourseII'* means additional language, a selection of both is compulsory for all students under going under graduate programmes.
- 3.6. 'ComplementaryCourse' means a course which would enrich the study of corecourses.
- 3.7. 'Corecourse' means a course in the subject of specialization within a degree programme.
- 3.8. 'Course' means a complete unit of learning which will be taught and evaluated within a semester.
- 3.9. 'Credit'is the numerical value assigned to a course according to the relative importance of the content of the syllabus of the programme.
- 3.10. 'Department' means any teaching department in a college.
- 3.11. *DepartmentCo-ordinator* is ateachernominated by a Department Council to co-ordinate the continuous evaluation undertaken in that department.
- 3.12. 'Department Council' means the body of all teachers of a department in a college.
- 3.13. 'Faculty Advisor' means a teacher from the parent department nominated by the Department Council. who will advise the studentin the choice of his/her courses and other academic matters.
- 3.14. **GraceMarks** shall beawardedtocandidatesaspertheUniversityOrders issuedfromtime totime.
- 3.15. '*Grade*' means a lettersymbol(e.g.,A,B,C,etc.), which indicates the broadlevelof performance of a student inacourse/semester/programme.
- 3.16. 'Gradepoint' (GP) is the numerical indicator of the percentage of marks a warded to a student in a course.

- 3.17. 'Opencourse' means a course outside the field of his/her specialization, which can be opted by a student.
- 3.18. 'ParentDepartment' meansthedepartment whichofferscorecourses within a degree programme.
- 3.19. **'Programme'** meansa three/fouryear programmeofstudyandexaminationsspreadover six/eightsemesters,according to theregulationsoftherespectiveprogramme,thesuccessful completionofwhichwouldleadtotheawardofadegree
- 3.20. 'Semester' means a termconsisting of a minimum of 450 contact hours distributed over 90 working days, inclusive of examination days, within 18 five-day academic weeks.
- 3.21. Words and expressions used and not defined in this regulation shall have the same meaning assigned to the minthe Act and Statutes.

4. ELIGIBILITYFORADMISSION, ANDRESERVATION OF SEATS

4.1 Eligibility of admission, Normsforadmission, reservation of seats for various Degree Programmes shall be according to the rules framed by the college from time.

5. DURATION

- 5.1 Thedurationof U.G. programmes shall be 6/8 semesters (the semesters defined under 3.20, above).
- 5.2 The duration of odds emesters shall be from **June to October** and that of even semesters from **Novemberto March.** The reshall be three days semester break after odds emesters and two months vacation during April and May in every acade micyear.
- 5.3 AstudentmaybepermittedtocompletetheProgramme,onvalidreasons,withinaperiod of 12/16 continuous semesters from the date of commencement of the first semester of the programme.

6. REGISTRATION

- **6.1**The strength of students for each courseshall remain as perexisting regulations, except in case of open courses for which the reshall be maximum of 50 students per batch.
- **6.2** Each student shall register for the courses in the prescribed registration form in consultation with the FacultyAdvisorwithin twoweeks from the commencementofeach semester. FacultyAdviser shallpermitregistration on the basis of the preferences of the student and availability of seats.
- **6.3**Thenumberofcourses/credits that studentcan take in asemesteris governedby the provisions in the seregulations pertaining to the minimum and maximum number of credits permitted.
- **6.4**A student canoptout ofacourse/coursesregisteredsubjecttothe minimumcredits requirement, within seven days from the commencement of the semester.

- **6.5**The collegeshallsendalistofstudents registeredfor each programmeineachsemester giving the details of courses registeredincluding repeat courses to the University in the prescribed form within 20 days from the commencement of the Semester.
- **6.6**Thosestudentswhopossessthe requiredminimumattendanceandprogressduringan academic year/semester and could not register for the annual/semester examination are permitted to apply for Notional Registration to the examinations concerned enabling them to get promoted to the next class.

7. SCHEMEANDSYLLABUS

- **7.1**. The U.G. programmes shall include (a) Common courses I & II, (b) Corecourses, (c) Complementary Courses, (d) Open Course.
- **7.2.**CreditTransfer andAccumulation systemcan be adopted the programme. Transfer of Creditconsists of acknowledging, recognizing and accepting credits by an institution for programmesor courses completed at another institution. The CreditTransferScheme shall allow students pursuing a programme in one University to continue their education in another University without break.

8. PROGRAMMESTRUCTURE

Thereshall beamaximum ofthreecreditsfor theopencourseandremainingonecredit shouldbeshiftedtochoicebasedcourseor anyother corecourse.

9. EXAMINATIONS.

9.1 Theevaluationofeachcourseshall containtwoparts: (i) Internal

orIn-SemesterAssessment (ISA)

(ii) External or End-SemesterAssessment (ESA)

The internaltoexternalassessmentratioshallbe 1:4,for both courses with orwithout practical. The reshall beam aximum of 80 marks for external evaluation and maximum of 20 marks for internal evaluation. For all courses (theory & practical), grades are given on a 07-point scale based on the total percentage of marks. (ISA+ESA) as given below

10. CREDITPOINTANDCREDITPOINTAVERAGE Credit Point

(CP)ofacourse iscalculated using the formula

CP= CxGP, where C= Credit; GP=Gradepoint

Credit Point Average (CPA) of a Semester/Programme is calculated using the formula

CPA=TCP/TC, where TCP=TotalCredit Point; TC=TotalCredit

Grades for the different semesters and overall programme are given based on the corresponding CPA as shown below:

Note:Aseparateminimumof30% markseachforinternaland external(forboththeoryand practical) andaggregate minimum of40% are requiredfor a pass for acourse. For a passina programme, aseparateminimum ofGradeEis requiredfor alltheindividualcourses. Ifacandidate secures FGrade for any one of the coursesofferedin a Semester/ProgrammeonlyFgrade willbe awardedfor thatSemester/Programmeuntilhe/she improves this toEgrade or above within the permittedperiod. Candidatewhosecures Egrade and above will be eligible for higher studies.

11.MARKS DISTRIBUTION FOR EXTERNAL EXAMINATION AND INTERNAL EVALUATION

Theexternalexaminationofallsemestersshallbeconducted by the college at the end of each semester. Internal evaluation is to be done by continuous assessment. 14.SEMINAR/VIVA

A studentshall present a seminar in the $5^{\rm th}$ semester and appear for Viva-voce in the $6^{\rm th}$ semester.

15. INTERNALASSESSMENTTESTPAPERS

Atleastoneinternaltest-paperis tobe attendedineachsemester for each course. The evaluationsofall components are tobe published and are to be acknowledged by the candidates. All documents of internal assessments are to be keptin the college for two years. The responsibility of evaluating the internal assessment is vested on the teacher (s), who teach the course.

15.1 Grievance Redressal Mechanism

Internalassessmentshallnotbe usedasa toolfor personalor other type ofvengeance. A studenthasallrightstoknow,howtheteacherarrivedatthemarks. Inordertoaddressthe grievance ofstudents athree-level GrievanceRedressal mechanismis envisaged. Astudentcan approach theupper level only ifgrievanceisnot addressedat the lower level.

Level1:Dept.Level: ThedepartmentcellchairedbytheHead;andDept.coordinatorand teacher incharge,asmembers.

Level2: Collegelevel: A committee with the Principal as Chairman, Dept. Coordinator, HOD of concerned Department and a senior teacher no minated by the College council as members.

15.2 The college councils hall no minate a senior teacher as coordinator of internal evaluations.

This coordinator shall make arrangements for giving awareness of the internal evaluation components tostudents immediately after commencement of Isemester

15.3 TheinternalevaluationreportintheprescribedformatshouldreachThe Controller of Examinations before the 4th week of October and Marchinevery academic year.

16. External examination

The external examination of all semesters shall be conducted by the college at the end of each semester.

16.1 Studentshavinga minimumof75% averageattendanceforallthecoursesonlycanregister forthe examination. Condonationofshortageofattendancetoa maximumof10 daysor50hoursina semestersubjecttoa maximum of2timesduring thewhole periodofthe programmemay be grantedbythecollege onvalidgrounds. This condonations hall not be counted for internal assessment.

Benefit of attendance may be granted to students attending University/College union/Co-curricular activities by treating them as present for the days of absence, on production of participation/attendance certificates, within one week, from competent authorities and endorsed by the Head of the institution. This is limited to a maximum of 10 days per semester and this benefit shall be considered for internal assessment also.

Those students who are not eligible even with condonation of shortage of attendance shall repeat the course along with the next batch.

- **16.2** Allstudentsaretodoa**project**. Thisprojectcanbedoneindividuallyorasagroupof3 students. Theprojectsare tobe identifiedduringtheII semester oftheprogrammewith thehelp ofthesupervisingteacher. Thereportoftheprojectinduplicateistobesubmittedtothe departmentatthe sixth semesterandaretobe producedbefore theexaminersappointedby the college.
- **16.3**Therewillbenosupplementaryexams. Forreappearance/improvement,thestudentscan appear alongwiththenext batch.
- **16.4** A studentwhore gistershis/hername for the external exam for a semester will be eligible for promotion to the next semester.
- **16.5** A student who has completed the entire curriculum requirement, but could not register for the Semester examination can register notionally, for getting eligibility for promotion to the next semester.
- **16.6**Acandidatewhohasnot securedminimummarks/credits ininternal examinationscanre-dothe same registeringalong with the Finalexamination for the same semester, subsequently.
- 17. Allprogrammesandcoursesshallhaveuniquealphanumericcode. Eachteacherworkingin affiliated institutionsshallhave a unique identification numberand this numberis to be attached with the codesof thecoursesfor whichhe/shecanperformexaminationduty.

18. PATTERNOFQUESTIONS

Questionsshall beset toassessknowledgeacquired,standardapplicationofknowledge, applicationofknowledgeinnew situations,critical evaluationofknowledgeandtheabilityto synthesizeknowledge. Thequestionsetter shall ensurethat questionscoveringall skillsareset. He/Sheshall also submit adetailed scheme of evaluational on gwith the question paper.

Aquestionpaper shall beajudiciousmixofobjectivetype, short answer type, shortessaytype /problemsolvingtypeandlongessaytypequestions.
