

Rebuild Kerala

The year 2018 witnessed a very heavy monsoon and the worst flood ever in the history of Kerala. The TROP team of St. Teresa's College joined hands with the state government's Rebuild Kerala Mission and mobilized the entire first year Under Graduate students for an online Mobile App based household survey to assess the damages to properties in the flood affected areas of Cheranalloor Grama Panchayat. The students, as registered volunteers under the Rebuild Kerala Mission, successfully surveyed 3460 houses spread over 17 wards at Cheranalloor. 754 students from St.Teresa's College registered and actively took part in the post flood survey on 15th and 18th September 2018.

Unnat Bharat Abhyan
