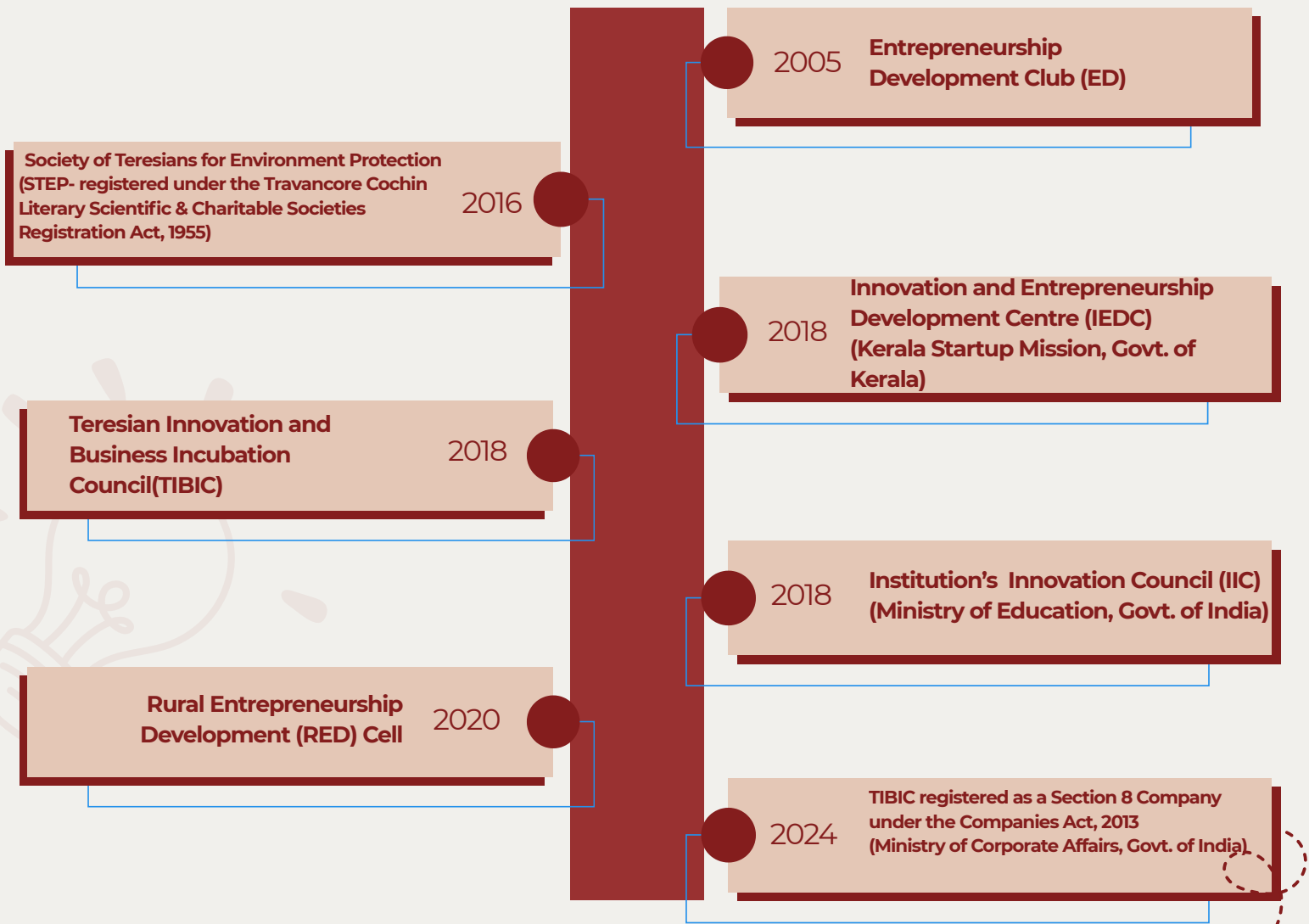

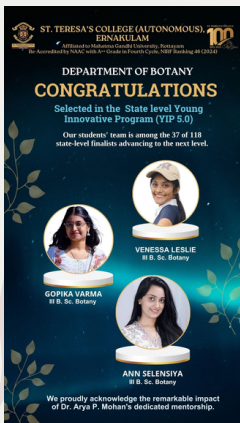


## KSUM IDEATHON WINNERS

## Puthenvelikkara Project: Formulation of Action Plan

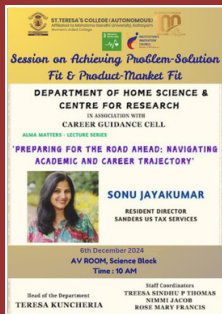

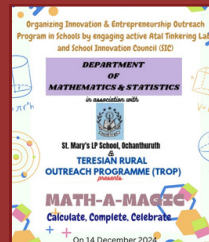
## Intellectual Property Rights Awareness Session

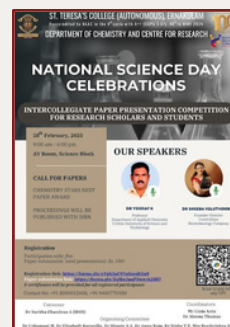


## Workshop on Sales, Marketing & Angel Investment

Discover, Define, Drive

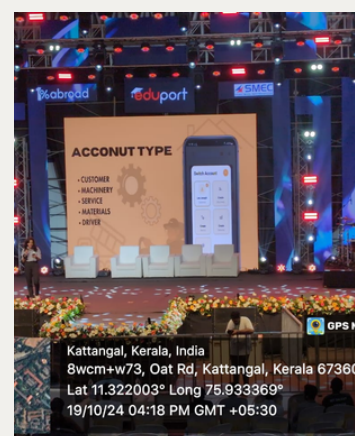

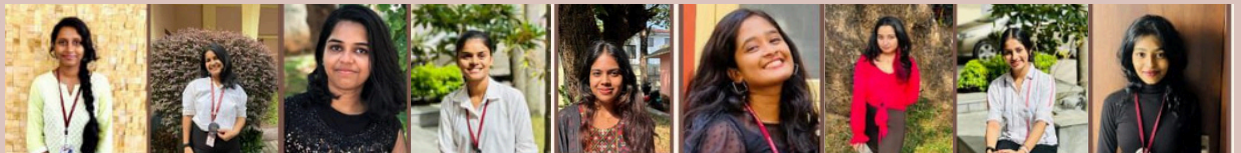

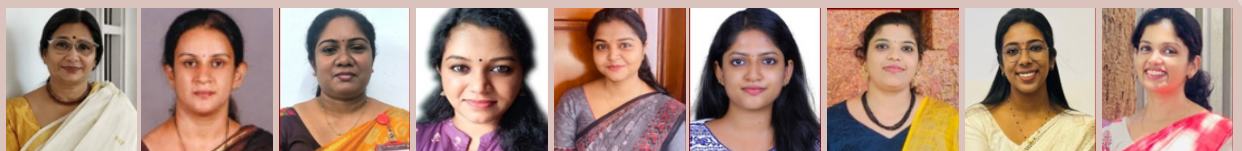
